

Biblical History in the Mediterranean

Historical and Archaeological Study Program

Greece, Italy and Mediterranean Islands

April 26 – May 7, 2012

In the spring, we will embark on a 12-day historical and archaeological study program sponsored by Biblical Research Foundation and the American Institute for Advanced Biblical Studies in Little rock, Arkansas. We will visit many of the locations mentioned in the New Testament of the Bible. This is not just an ordinary tour but an intensive, historical and archaeological study seminar.

We have designed a special itinerary that will allow participants to earn up to 9 hours of college credit through the American Institute for Advanced Biblical Studies and see what the ordinary tourist would never have the opportunity to see – all for the special price of \$4750 per person. Included in this price are:

- Airline flights from and to New York JFK (including airline taxes of \$142 and fuel charges of \$420*)
- 6 nights 4-star hotel accommodation with daily breakfast and dinner at hotels
- 5 nights/6 days on a memorable Mediterranean cruise aboard the smart and stylish Louis Majesty, a contemporary ship of Louis Cruiselines. All rooms reserved are outside state rooms.
- Arrival/departure transfers with portorage at airport and hotels, cruise port taxes and low fuel surcharge
- Daily touring with lectures at each site as per your itinerary
- Entrance fees as listed in your itinerary



Not included are your personal tips and gratuities for hotels, drivers and guides, travel insurance and any personal items or food for lunch that you may wish to purchase. (Although tips are purely voluntary, it is suggested you consider about \$15 per day total.)

April 26, Days 1 and 2, we depart New York and fly to Athens, Greece and will stay overnight at the Astor Hotel very near the Acropolis. Flight reservations are on Alitalia Airlines as follows:

April 28, Day 3 – Today, we will visit the Acropolis, (photo on left) the Parthenon and Mars Hill where Paul preached to the Athenians. In the afternoon, we visit the National Archaeology Museum.

April 29, Day 4 – We will journey to Cenchrea and visit the city of Phoebe, the first deaconess mentioned in the New Testament. In Cenchrea, we will see the ruins of the church dedicated in her honor which is now largely under water. We then proceed on to ancient Corinth - the city of the Corinthians - and view the remains of this ancient city where Paul preached.

April 30 – Day 5 – We board our ship, the lovely Louis Majesty, (left photo below) where all will all enjoy outside cabins and then set sail to Mykonos, a quaint and colorful little island. (right photo below) Mykonos is today a haven for the jet set and the location of a very well-known artist colony. Participants may elect to participate in a half-day shore excursion for an additional cost. (*Mykonos Walking Tour - ADULT:\$64.00*) More information on shore excursions is attached to this itinerary.



May 1 – Day 6 – We arrive at Kusadasi (Ephesus) and visit what is truly an archaeological wonder of the ancient world. Individuals may purchase an additional shore excursion for an additional cost. (*Ancient Ephesus (KUS – 02) Half day ADULT:\$88.00*) Shore excursion participants will depart the ship and board an air-conditioned motor coach that will take us through the colorful and bustling town of Kusadasi and along the coastal highway to Mt. Koressos.

We will continue on to the site of Ancient Ephesus to walk through the Magnesian Gate, the entrance to the ancient city and enjoy a walking tour through one of the most magnificent of the excavated cities in the world. Here, we will visit the very amphitheater, with seating capacity of 24,000, where Paul preached to the Ephesians. One could write a book about the importance of Ephesus and the events that occurred there. On our way back to Kusadasi, we will be able to view the Basilica of St. John and the famous Temple of Artemis, one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. Before returning to our ship, we will be able to enjoy free time in Kusadasi to shop for every conceivable item, such as carpets, jewelry, local souvenirs, leather goods and Turkish delights.

Upon leaving Ephesus, we will journey to the quaint little island of Patmos where the Apostle John was banished and spent several years in exile. Individuals may purchase an additional shore excursion for an additional cost. (*St. John's Monastery & Grotto of the Apocalypse - Half day - ADULT:\$72.00*) Shore excursion participants will enjoy a short journey to the village of Chora where the Monastery of St. John is built within the walls of a strong fortification. You will marvel at this magnificent structure, which was built 900 years ago and is exceptional in its architecture. Our journey will then take us to the nearby Grotto of the Apocalypse, where above stands the church of the Apocalypse, a sub-unit of the main Monastery. As you walk

down the steps to visit the Grotto of the Apocalypse, you will see silver niches in the wall that mark the pillow and ledge used as a desk by John as he authored the Book of Revelations. We will drive back to the port of Scala and enjoy some free time in this quaint and picturesque harbor before we return to our ship

May 2 – Day 7 – Today, we arrive at the Island of Rhodes, Greece, which has a long and rich history going back to 1500 BCE. It was here that Chares worked on the famous Colossos of Rhodes, one of the seven wonders of the Ancient World. Around 300 BCE the Colossus stood for less than 100 years and was destroyed by an earthquake about 227 BCE.

Participants may wish to purchase an additional shore excursion for an additional cost. (*Rhodes & Lindos Combined - Half day - ADULT: \$77.00*) where we will drive along the picturesque eastern coastline, scattered with whitewashed villages until we reach Lindos. Medieval walls constructed by the Knights of St. John in the 13th century guard this enchanting site, the most important of the three great cities of ancient times. Within the walls stands the ancient Acropolis of Lindos on the edge of a precipice 400 feet above sea level.

You will stand in awe of the breathtaking views of the great expanse of the Pelagos and St. Paul's Bay where the Apostle himself cast anchor during his historic voyage to Ephesus. We will proceed, on foot, up the great steps to the Temple of Athena, before having time to for shopping in the myriad of colorful stores that line the narrow streets of the village.

Our motor coach will take us back to the town of Rhodes where we will commence our walking tour of Rhodes at the Port d'Amboise and stroll through the Medieval Old City to view the Palace of the Knights of St. John and the medieval houses of the knights.

May 3 – Day 8 – We arrive at the Island of Crete. Travelers may elect to participate in an additional shore excursion for an additional cost. (*Knossos Palace – Half day – ADULT: \$82.00*) where we drive from the Port of Heraklion to Knossos, the ancient capital of the prehistoric Minoan civilization. Here we will visit the excavated and partly reconstructed palace of King Minos, decorated with frescoes and shields. We will see the King's Chamber housing the alabaster throne (see photo to right) and the queen's apartment adorned with murals of dolphins and spirals reminding us of the legend of the Labyrinth, as well as the beautiful courtyards and shrines. We will board our motor coach and drive to the city of Heraklion where you can spend free time in town to browse the shops. Afterwards, return to the port by motor coach in time for the ship's departure.

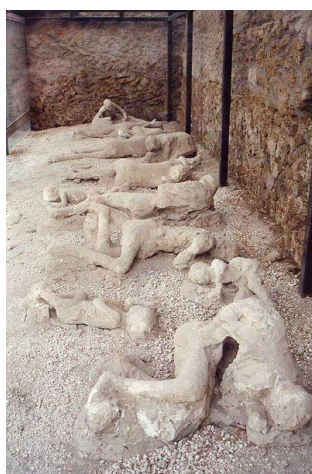


Later, we will head toward Santorini where sailing into the Caldera of Santorini is like floating inside a giant open-air geological museum. Travelers may elect to participate in an additional shore excursion for an additional cost. (*Excursion to Oia Village – Half day – ADULT: \$79.00*) Excursion participants will take a short boat trip to Athenios harbor where we meet our motor coach and drive along the rocky sides of the Caldera until we reach the unique village of Oia with its cycladic architecture and houses perched on the cliff's edge. We will walk through the village along cobble stone streets and marvel at the breathtaking panoramic views and the traditional architecture. Everyone will enjoy a little free time here to wander the many art galleries, relax over coffee. before return to the small pier of Scala by cable car or mule where the tendering service awaits to take us back to our ship. Set sail to Athens.

May 4 – Day 9 – In Athens, we disembark our ship and transfer to the Athens airport to fly on to Rome. Once in Rome, we will have an orientation tour by bus through the city and arrive at our hotel, the Palatino Rome.

May 5 – Day 10 – Today, we head to Pompeii and Herculaneum, the most famous of the towns along the Italian coast, destroyed in August of 79 CE with the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. The explosion devastated seaside towns through the Bay of Naples, but it also uniquely preserved for posterity the evidence of Roman life in the first century when Roman life was at its most vigorous. Excavation began in the 18th century and the story of the excavations gives insight into the history of archaeology itself. We will spend as much time as possible visiting this unique archaeological site where two-thirds of the ancient Roman city has been excavated over the past 250 years. Our visit to Herculaneum will complement our visit to Pompei. Much less of Herculaneum has been excavated but what we will see is better preserved and, again, gives insight into the thriving Roman city of the first century.

Below you see a computer-generated depiction of the eruption of Vesuvius in AD 79, which buried Pompeii, and some plaster casts of victims of the eruption still in actual Pompeii; many are in the Archaeological Museum of Naples. (Casts can also be found, amongst other places, near the forum, inside the baths, and at the Villa of the Mysteries.)



May 6 – Day 11 – Today will be spent in Rome. An entire book could be written on the history of what we will see in Rome today. Some of the highlights will be the Coliseum, the Forum, the archaeological remains from the ancient city of Rome and much more.

May 7 – Day 12 – Transfer back to Rome Airport for our return flight to New York and home.

## ***Optional Shore Excursions***

*Although optional shore excursions are noted in the main body of our itinerary, we are repeating them here for special emphasis and further detail.*

### **RATES PER PERSON**

#### **HERAKLION, GREECE**

##### ***Knossos Palace (HER – 02) Half day ADULT – \$82.00***

Crete is the largest and the most rugged of the Greek islands. It is also the home of the great Minoan Civilization and the mythological home of Zeus. After a short drive through the town of Heraklion the tour will arrive at the Knossos excavations. Here, Sir Arthur Evans' archaeological discoveries revealed a civilization dating back to 4000 B.C., when a great empire flourished on the island of Crete. Based on the wealth of artifacts that were found, Evans theorized that this was the site of the ancient Minoan Kingdom. These findings will be viewed in detail, as your guide will lead you on a journey of discovery to learn of the sophisticated culture that flourished thousands of years ago on this island. The Palace, decorated with frescoes and shields houses the Hall of the Royal Guard, the Hall of the Double Axes, the King's Chamber with the alabaster throne, the Queen's Apartment, beautiful courtyards and shrines. Having visited this remarkable site your coaches will take you back to the Venetian lion-guarded port of Heraklion to rejoin your ship.

#### **REMARKS**

Walking in the archaeological site of Knossos will be on uneven gravel surfaces. Passengers may not be allowed to enter the site with big bags/rucksacks.

#### **KUSADASI, TURKEY**

##### ***Ancient Ephesus (KUS – 02) Half day ADULT – \$88.00***

Drive through the colorful town of Kusadasi and along the coast to reach Ephesus, famous in antiquity for its Temple of Diana - one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World - and later the home of St. John. During the years of the Roman Empire, the Greek port of Ephesus became the greatest city in Asia Minor. Upon arrival at Ephesus follow your guide to enter the ancient site through the Magnesian Gate. Discover innumerable monuments including the Forum, the Odeon, the Library of Celsus, the Thermal Baths of Scolastika and the Great Theatre built in the Greek Era and reconstructed in the Roman period, which is still noted for its remarkable acoustics. View the symbols all around and marvel at the fact that one is still able to read the inscriptions in the ancient Greek language. Walk back to your coach along the Arcadian Way, where once Mark Anthony and Cleopatra rode in procession. As you drive back to Kusadasi, on a hill above Selcuk, just outside Ephesus, view the Basilica of St. John, which was erected over his grave in the 6<sup>th</sup> Century A.D. by Emperor Justinian. Before returning to the ship, get a cultural taste of Turkey by enjoying an exhibition of oriental carpets, jewelry or leather goods.

#### **REMARKS**

Tour not suitable for passengers with walking difficulties.

## MYKONOS, GREECE

### ***Mykonos Walking Tour (MYK – 01) Half day ADULT – \$64.00***

Mykonos is world famous. It is the most cosmopolitan of the Greek Islands and attracts many visitors from all over the globe, including large numbers of artists and intellectuals. Your coach will take you to “Hora” the island’s capital where you will enjoy a walking tour in the narrow cobbled streets of the town, passing by chic boutiques, elegant nightclubs and white-washed houses until reaching Alefkandra. Alefkandra is a charming corner of Hora, known also as the “Venice” of Mykonos. The houses are built on the sea, with wooden balconies that evoke Venice. These were built from the mid. 18th Century onward and were homes of wealthy merchants and captains. At Louis Theoxenia Hotel, you will enjoy the atmosphere while drinking your refreshment accompanied by Greek ‘meze’. You will return then to Mykonos Town (Hora) from where you will take the ship’s shuttle service back to the port to meet your ship.

#### **REMARKS**

During the low season the refreshment will take place in a local tavern.

## PATMOS, GREECE

### ***St. John’s Monastery & Grotto of the Apocalypse (PAT – 01) Half day ADULT – \$72.00***

Depart from the port of Scala and enjoy a short drive to the village of Chora, where the Monastery of St. John is built within the walls of a strong fortification. As you walk uphill towards the entrance of the monastery marvel at this magnificent structure, which was built 900 years ago. View the courtyard, the monks’ dining room and the old bakery before you visit the main church noted for its outstanding frescoes and interior decoration. Next, visit the small museum where priceless ecclesiastical treasures, books, manuscripts, mosaics, icons, splendid medieval textiles, vestments and jewelry are housed. Return to your motor coach and continue to the nearby Grotto of the Apocalypse. Walk down the steps to the Grotto of the Apocalypse. Here you will see the niches in the wall that mark the pillow and ledge used as a desk by the author of the Book of the Revelation and the crack in the rock made by the voice of God honoring the Holy Trinity. Afterwards, drive back to the port of Scala and enjoy some free time in this quaint and picturesque town.

#### **REMARKS**

Tour not suitable for passengers with walking difficulties.

## RHODES, GREECE

### *Rhodes & Lindos Combined (RHO – 01) Half day ADULT – \$77.00*

Drive along the picturesque south-eastern coastline, dotted with white-washed villages, to Lindos, one of the most important of the three great cities of ancient times. See how this entire city is guarded by medieval walls which were constructed by the knights of St. John in the 13th Century. Within them stands the ancient Acropolis of Lindos, on the brink of a precipice 122 m above the sea. From the Acropolis, marvel at the breathtaking views covering the great expanse of the Aegean Sea and St. Paul's Bay, where the apostle cast anchor during his historic voyage to Ephesus.

Proceed on foot uphill, to the great staircase leading from the Hellenistic Portico to the Acropolis and Temple of Athena. Should you wish to make your way up by mule, a fee must be paid to the local muleteer. After the guided tour of the Acropolis, enjoy some free time on your own in Lindos village before meeting up with your motor coach. Return to Rhodes city and enjoy a panoramic drive through the new part of the city before continuing to Mount Smith to see the ruins of ancient Rhodes, the Temple of Apollo and Diagoras Stadium. Afterwards your motor coach will drop you off at Porte d'Amboise, the start of the walking tour through the medieval city of Rhodes. Follow your guide through the northern part where once lived the knights and their attendants. View the Palace of the Knights, continue your walk down Chevaliers Road to the Marine Gate and return back to the ship. A short visit to a ceramic factory is included.

#### **REMARKS**

Please note that the journey from Rhodes to Lindos is approx. 50 minutes. Tour not suitable for passengers with walking difficulties.

## SANTORINI, GREECE

### *Excursion to Oia Village (SAN – 01) Half day ADULT – \$79.00*

Driving along the road you will have the unique opportunity to admire the panoramic view of the Aegean Sea and the neighboring islands. A unique sight is the various layers of lava that can be seen on the face of the rock, each layer being another phase of the activity of the volcano. Built on the Caldera rim, Oia Village is an excellent example of Cycladic architecture. Explore the village walking along the cobble-stone streets and the white washed houses with blue shutters where one gets the impression that they are a beautiful travel poster.

Your coach will bring you back to the port of Athinios, where you will embark your tender boat.

#### **REMARKS**

It will be possible to remain in Fira and reach the port by cable car. Passengers will have to purchase the ticket at the cable car station.

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Cost of tour per person, based on double occupancy, including air from New York JFK Airport \$ 4,750 (\$500 deposit required to hold place), Single supplement \$ 920

**PAYMENTS:** A deposit of \$500 per person is required to secure your place on the program, along with signed application form. (Full deposit may be refunded only if Bible Scholars, Inc./ American Institute/Canaan Tours withdraw the offer of the program.) Final payment is due to Canaan Tours no later than 60 days prior to departure date (February 26, 2012). Thereafter, a late payment fee of US \$100 per person will be assessed, plus any penalty assessed by airline and/or hotels.

**TIPS, TAXES, MISC.:** Participants should keep in mind that personal tips for services rendered both off and on ship are not included. They are voluntary but we recommend including \$5-10 per day for tips for services to drivers, guides, waiters, hotel and restaurant staff, bus drivers and other service personnel.

**CANCELLATION & REFUND POLICY:** All cancellations for any reason and at any time must be received in writing and will be subject to a \$200 per person administrative fee. Cancellation between 90-61 days of departure will be subject to additional loss of some non-recoverable sums from independent providers of land and air services. **ITINERARY LENGTH:** Your flight times are subject to change without advance notice.
